Academics

As a non-selective school, HSW still maintains a strong emphasis on academia as well as sports and the arts. We are proud that our examination results continue to grow year on year and are significantly above the national average.

HSW aims to offer a diverse and rich curriculum to all pupils. As a school who is always looking towards the future, we have the ability to adapt our curriculum to enable more opportunities for our young people, based on the demands of a developing world. Our small class sizes allow teachers and pupils to develop excellent working relationships. Each pupil is valued for their uniqueness and their individual needs are supported to reach their greatest potential.





Creative Subjects

Experience of a diverse education enables children to explore their potential, it stimulates their intellectual curiosity and it allows them to acquire new skills and discover the subjects that are of most interest to them. Vital for personal development, social and physical wellbeing, wider achievements and life chances, creative subjects are becoming ever more important in this technological age.

We encourage all pupils to enjoy, learn and perform music. As part of the curriculum, pupils study music theory, composition and a range of styles and genres, as well as an array of performance opportunities.

Art lessons take place with specialist teachers in our bright and airy studios. We aim to provide pupils with a firm foundation in art techniques and a keen interest in traditional and contemporary art.

Drama is a popular and prominent feature of the curriculum and gives pupils of all ages an opportunity to develop their confidence in performing. We aim to introduce children to a wide variety of plays as well as stage management, scenery and lighting. All pupils are offered the opportunity to perform in year group productions, often of a musical nature, which take place every year.

Our creative curriculum is complemented by LAMDA exams, trips to theatres, art galleries, concerts, museums, international destinations and residential trips, all of which often underpin project work within the classroom.

Learning Support and EAL

Occasionally, children will need the support of trained specialists in order to overcome difficulties they may have accessing the curriculum. We are proud that our SEND provision offers whatever support might be necessary to our pupils so that they can grow in confidence.

With a diverse pupil body, our overseas pupils can benefit enormously from our excellent EAL (English as an Additional Language) programme.



Beyond academics, our co-curricular offering is designed to provide a vast array of opportunities. Our extensive programme of clubs, trips, visiting speakers and activities ensures that pupils engage both in and outside of the classroom.

We encourage a competitive nature across the age groups through our inter-house competitions in a variety of disciplines.

Senior pupils greatly benefit from The Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme which is an enjoyable, challenging and rewarding personal development programme. Along with the occasional blister and aching shoulders, they pick up experiences and skills that remain with them for the rest of their lives.

Every child is treated as an individual and is celebrated for who they are. Our intimate campus fosters a relaxed, family atmosphere where each member of the community is known.

Pastoral care is central to what we do; every pupil has a Form Tutor and Head of Year whom they can confide in. Tutors provide holistic guidance on their studies and their onward journey. We provide a safe, secure, stimulating and happy environment which allows children to reach their full potential both academically and socially. We believe in taking time to care for the whole child, aiming to nurture their emotional wellbeing and encourage life skills alongside academic development.

We want every pupil to feel cared for, appreciated and valued where every child participates fully and wholly in all aspects of school life. our future technology



All of our pupils study Digital Literacy. Amongst a world dealing with a pandemic, digital learning became more important than ever. We continue to believe technology is very important to the success of our pupils in a digital, inter-connected world and as such will continue to develop and invest in our resources. The school's online learning platform is Google Classroom. Teaching and learning outside of the classroom is largely done through this platform. Computer Science teaches computational and algorithmic thinking, and as far as possible dealing with real life problems. The programme of studies includes coding web pages with HTML 5 and CSS, developing computer games and animations with Scratch and programming with Python.

In September 2021, HSW will launch a brand new Sixth Form. This will embrace the school's philosophy of small classes and personalised learning, alongside outstanding teaching and pastoral care. Sixth Form students will benefit from all that HSW has to offer including close working relationships with teaching staff, fully refurbished classrooms and significant investment in technology to facilitate enhanced digital learning. Our initial curriculum will offer a broad combination of A level and or BTEC qualifications.

Highly Qualified Teaching

First Class Facilities

Less than a mile away is our extensive sports facility, Oberon Fields. Within this nine acre site sits a splendid pavilion which has been re-developed to become a hub for curriculum enrichment, with teaching spaces for outdoor learning, performing arts and cookery. There are refurbished changing rooms for boys and girls, a performing arts studio and a fully equipped kitchen. Outside, there will be a renovated multi-use court, a new nature trail, orchard, garden allotments and a Forest School area. Our fields include rugby and football pitches and a new cricket square. The fields will continue to be reconfigured to allow greater use for sports and athletics.
